The CMAA Australian Academy of Country Music incorporates the production and management of the two residential schools of the CMAA Australian College of Country Music and the Camerata School of Country Music. The Australian Academy of Country Music provides an innovative residential program that offers Australia's and New Zealand's talented and promising emerging country artists and specialist musicians the opportunity to broaden their horizons and skill levels via close interaction with industry's leading specialists.

For artists under 18 years Camerata's purpose is to educate, develop and stimulate artistic and creative development in Australian country music performers, in particular songwriters, by providing them with resources, skills and information to enable them to become leaders in the music industry locally, to perform and promote original Australian music globally. Camerata provides a centre for musical excellence, provides a fun and inspiring learning environment, develop song writing skills, and provides a foundation in writing and performing Australasian country music

The Academy of Country Music – School of Camerata will be held in Tamworth, NSW, commencing July 3rd and conclude July 8th 2010, and will cater to 21 students plus one parent per student. The remuneration for the position of Senior Tutor – Camerata is \$1,895.00 gst inclusive.
